Tour of the Scalo Solar SunScape Demonstration Project

The Scalo Solar SunScape Demonstration Project consists of three energy producing PV (photovoltaic) technologies, 5 different vegetative green roof systems, and a variety of energy efficiency products, including daylighting and reflective roof membranes.

The project is a living laboratory for universities and professionals to study and enhance sustainability in our region.

Scalo Solar Solutions, LLC, was the project manager for the \$1,000,000 solar installation on the roof of the Scalo Companies headquarters building in Crafton. Scalo Solar wrote and submitted a \$500,000 grant for Burns & Scalo Roofing Company, Inc. to the Pennsylvania Energy Development Authority. The award was approved by PEDDA on August 27, 2010.

The 105 kW system features three different solar technologies on varying roof types – all measured and compared by installation cost and operating efficiency.

In addition, a section of the polycrystalline panel system is mounted over vegetative green roofing to improve panel efficiency by lowering ambient air temperature. The research data obtained by this project will be correlated by local universities and professionals to provide objective performance data on solar for Western Pennsylvania.

Larry Bruce Justice -1952-2013

CSI Pittsburgh lost one of its most colorful members last month with the passing of Larry Justice. Larry lost his battle with cancer on Saturday, August 17, 2013 at Kindred Transitional Care in Greenwood, Indiana.

Larry had been a resident of Sewickley, PA working as an architect at Matthews International in Pittsburgh, PA for 14 years. A native of Indiana, Larry was a graduate of Ball State School of Architecture.

With Matthews International Gibraltar Mausoleum Construction Company, Larry designed mausoleums all over the United States and held architectural registration in nearly every state. Larry was a member of the American Institute of Architects as well as Preservation Pennsylvania.

As a CSI Pittsburgh Chapter member, Larry was a former Membership Chairman. He enjoyed dressing up as Santa Claus at the Chapter's Holiday Gala and handing out door prizes and other gifts. At Chapter tours, Larry would appear in a hardhat shaped like a cowboy hat. Larry drove a Mini Cooper and was a member of the PittStop Mini Club.

I had the opportunity to spend some time with Larry at CSI Convention in Philadelphia in 2010 and then again in Chicago in 2011. We played a trivia game at the host chapter event in Philly and it was surprising to see just how much Larry knew. He had a variety of diverse interests, and was interesting to converse with.

When Larry got sick this past spring, some of us visited him in the hospital. He was recovering from surgery to remove a brain tumor, and although his memory was giving him problems, he was cheerful as usual and asking about what was going on in the Chapter. The day after my visit, Larry went home to Indiana for the last time.

He was truly one of a kind. We will miss him.

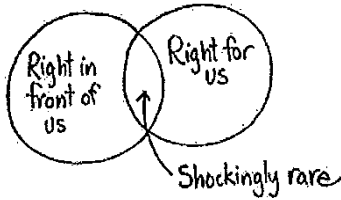

We wish Lee and Mike all the best in their new life together.

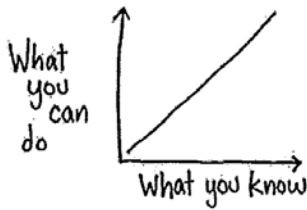


The Six Enemies of Greatness (and Happiness)



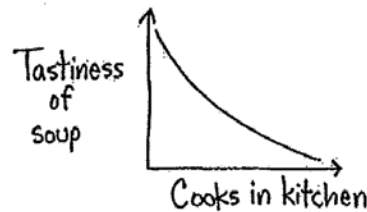
1) Availability

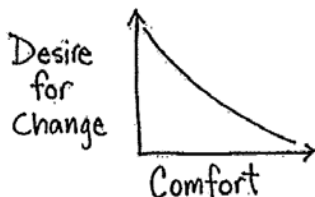
2) Ignorance

Nothing destroys a good idea faster than a mandatory consensus. The lowest common denominator is never a high standard.

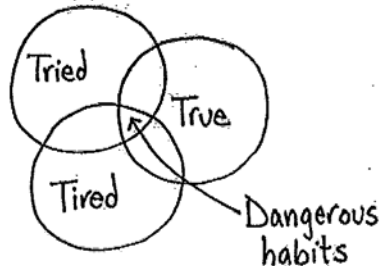


4) Comfort

Why pursue greatness when you've already got 324 channels and a recliner? Pass the dip and forget about your grand designs.

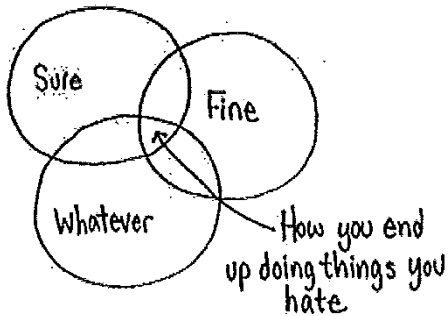
